Judge's Questionnaire

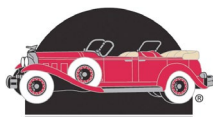
The following "questionnaire" was developed to encourage CCCA members to study the Judging Form, Rules, and Procedures, including recent revisions. Its purpose is to insure us that the judge is familiar with CCCA judging procedures. If you are a veteran judge, we hope you will consider this as a refresher course and an easy way of becoming acquainted with the recent changes.

There are four Classifications in our Judging System. Master Judge, Accredited Judge, Judge, and Judge in Training. Knowledge and experience determine what Classification an applicant will initially receive and for advancement. Master and Accredited Judge status requires approval of the Awards Committee.

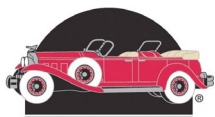
